ABOUT BHIWANI - THE CHHOTI KASHI

Bhiwani city, according to a legend, acquired its name from Bhani, the wife of a Rajput King- Maharaja Neempal Singh. The spelling changed to Bhiyani and subsequently to Bhiwani. Historically, Ain- e- Akbari also has references of Bhiwani, as it was one of the important centres of commerce during the Mughal period. Bhiwani is located at 28.78°N 76.13°E and has an average elevation of 225 metres. Bhiwani lies 285 kilometres from the state capital Chandigarh and 124 kilometres from the national capital Delhi. People of this region have extraordinary talents in sports and have represented Haryana at the national and international levels. The city has a conventional school of boxing, with almost all of the members of the Indian Boxing Squad coming from its nearby regions and has earned for itself the title of Mini Cuba. Bhiwani is also known as ‘Chhoti Kashi’ of India for having more than 300 temples. Some of the famous temples are Kirorimal temple, Star Temple, Devsar, Jogiwala mandir, and Khakhi Baba Mandir.

Bhiwani is a culturally and historically significant place. It boasts of so many important archaeological sites and is of perennial interest for the historians. ‘Prithviraj Ki Kutchehari’ is a place of historical testimony. The famous Rajput ruler Prithviraj Chauhan used to hold his court at this place. Another monument is the fort of Loharu. Among archaeological sites, Mitathal, a village situated about 12 kilometres from the city, is an important site for scholars investigating the “Eastern Domain” of the Indus Valley or Harappan Civilization. ‘Naurangabad mound’ is situated 10 km away from Bhiwani city and is known for the excavation site for antique coins, tools, toys, sieves, pots, and statues that are 2500 years old and belong to the era of Youdheya, Kushan and Gupta dynasties. Technological Institute of Textile, commonly known as TIT mills was established way back in 1911, also known as Grasim Bhiwani Textile Ltd. Chinar fabric is also one of the important textile mills of the city. In addition, Hindustan Gum & Chemical Ltd established in

1956, is a leading manufacturer and importer of Guar Gum in India and produces Guar Seeds, Guar Splits, and Guar Gum Powder.

Bhiwani has been traditionally a hub of higher education. It can boast of many degree colleges including Vaish College, Adarsh College for Women, MNS Government PG College, Government College for Women, besides many colleges of education. Bhiwani has emerged as a major Centre of Indian Boxing as all the four boxers representing India at Beijing Olympics 2008 are products of Sports Authority of India (SAI) boxing hostel at Bhiwani. Bhiwani is a hub of wrestling also. Furthermore, Bhiwani has been a rich center of Sanskrit learning. To add another feather to the glorious cap, the Government of Haryana has established a state University in the name of Chaudhary Bansi Lal and has thus given an impetus to the learning environment in the region.

Placement cell

Skill in Teaching

Introduction

Teaching skills are crucial when working as an educator. These skills are what help a teacher keep their classroom engaged and interested in learning. Teaching skills are the hard and soft skills that help a teacher keep students engaged. These skills can also help teachers position themselves as an educator, earning the attention and respect of their students. Some teaching skills come naturally to some, whereas others may require development with practice.

In this context, Under the broad curricular area, Engagement with the Field, 20 weeks (4+16) shall be allocated over the two years, Which is distributed as follows:



Distribution of Four Weeks:-

1. During the first year, to support better understanding of schools and in preparation of Internship, teacher education institutes shall make provisions for visits to innovative center of pedagogy and learning – innovative schools, educational resource centers etc.
2. Two weeks of First Year will be devoted to field engagement through different tasks and projects with the community, the school, and the child in school and out-of-school.
3. Two weeks of First/Second Year will be devoted and 12 practice lessons with the teaching practice for Pedagogy of School Subject I & II.(Two discussion lesson in each pedagogy of school subject).

INTERNSHIP

Internship should not be reduced to the ‘delivery’ of a certain number of lesson plans, but should aim for meaningful and holistic engagement with learners and the school. During the Internship, a student-teacher shall work as a regular teacher and participate in all the school activities, including planning, teaching and assessment, interacting with school teachers, community members and children.

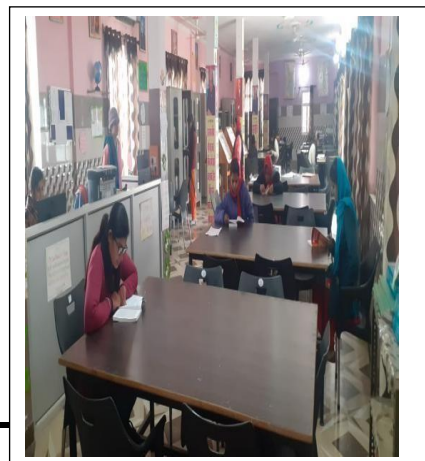
- Initially, the student-teachers will observe the school and its classrooms with regular teachers for one week.
- For each student-teacher, internship should be conducted preferably in one school within the District of concerned College of Education for the entire another 15 weeks. However, this period can be divided into two blocks in such a way that teaching in one school at a particular level (for example elementary or senior secondary).
- Student-teachers should be provided opportunities to teach in government and private schools with systematic supervisory support and feedback from Principal/faculty of the school and concerned College of Education giving preference to practice schools and limiting to concerned District only.
- After completing School Internship from the school, the Principal of the concerned College of Education will countersign the Certificate signed by Teacher Educator of concerned College and Principal of the School.



Facilities provided by College

Swami Vivekanand Library

Library is the heart & mind of an Educational institution and inspiration for student as well as the faculty members. To provide a successful path to our students , Swami Vivekanand Library is functioning in our college . It has been systematically equipped & computerized for issuing & returning books . It is fully Wi-Fi connected and books are **bar- coded** with the help of installed **techliv-0.7 software**. Under the supervision of our hard working librarian **Mrs. Parveen Kumari** , maintenance of our library is superb . There are plenty of books, Encyclopedia , Dictionary , News-papers, Journals , Reference books, Work books in our library for varied age groups. These collection is well classified and shelved according to the bar coding i.e. Total no. of books =6829, Reference books =1617, General books =4046, Dictionaries =7& Encyclopedia =88, Book bank 1001, National Journals=4, International Journals=1, Magazines= 5, Year Book=1, Electronic data(CD)=27& newspaper=5 . There is one photocopy machine, which is effectively used by all the students and faculty members according to their need .



Conference Hall

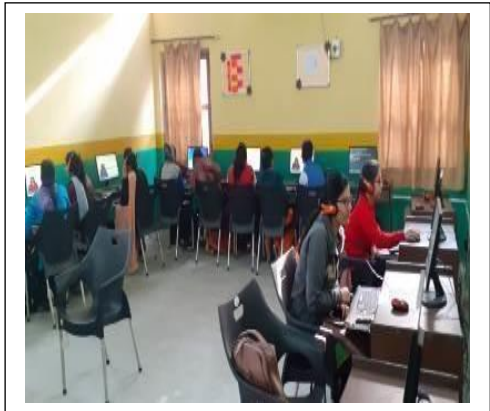
Our college has its own conference hall, in which important events and activities are organised regularly. It is very well furnished and well equipped with proper seating capacity with a professionally deployed acoustic system .

This hall has all the facilities to enhance the learning process and serves the requirement of quality education.

The objective behind the establishment of Conference hall, is to enhance quality education. To make this possible, it offers facilities such as LCD projectors , screen for delivering lectures. It also provide ample opportunity for our staff and students to exhibit their talent.

Language Lab

Modern interactive Language Lab play an important role in the language learning process because it is a technological aid for learning . In our college, language lab is established to enable our students to speak with clarity and accuracy for effective communication . In the direction of our college incharge. our students practices more and more .



Main purpose of the language lab is to enhance listening speaking , reading & writing skill in users. Computer Lab

Multi-Purpose Hall

The Multi- Purpose Hall is centrally air conditioned to provide high level of comfort to our spectators with seating capacity of 100 persons . It is expensively used by the students and faculty members for extra co-curricular activities and for hosting function of the college . It has an advanced electricity facility and sound system that is managed by specially designated staff along with the students. This well designed hall is equipped with a large stage and comfort seating . It also features a **Projector, white screen** and fully Wi-Fi connected . It is specially used for holding Seminars , Group Discussions and Extension lectures etc .

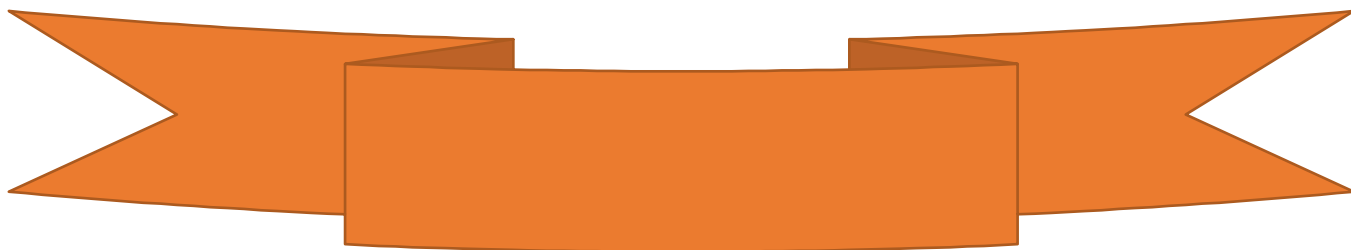


Eligibility Conditions for Admission to B.Ed. Two Year Regular Course

Candidates with at least 50% marks either in the Bachelor Degree and/or 55% marks in the Master's Degree or any other qualification recognized as equivalent there to are eligible for admission to the programme.

Note :-

- (i) There shall be no rounding off of percentage of marks of the qualifying examination from 0.5% and above to next higher number for determining the eligibility i.e. 49.5% and above will not be rounded off to 50%.
- (ii) 47.5% marks for SC/ST candidates of Haryana State only. As per letter dated :- 16-07-2014
- (iii) 47.5% marks for Blind /Persons with Disabilities and visually/Hearing Impaired candidates.
- (iv) Incase of Master's degree in sciences/social sciences/Humanity, Bachelor's in Engineering or Technology with specialisation in science and mathematics with 55% marks(52.25% in case of SC/ST/Blind/Persons with difrentlty abled and visually/Hearing impaired candidated of Haryana only)any other qualification equilvalent there to,are eligible for admsision to the programme.
- (v) Compartmental candidates will not be allowed admission in B.Ed. (Regular Course) in any case.
- (vi) Cut off date for eligibility will be the last date/time of online choice filling.
- (vii) One year PG diploma in any subject will not be considered equivalent to Master's Degree.

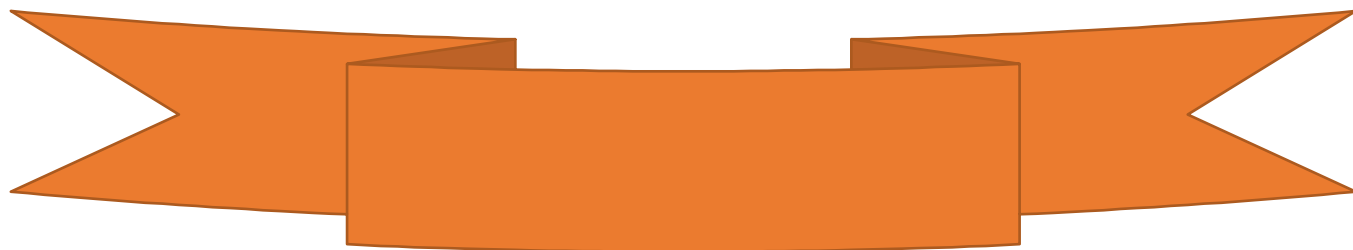

 - (b) Private Candidates: Candidates, who have passed the qualifying examination as private candidates should submit their Character Certificate, duly signed by a Notary Public.
 - (c) Gaps in study: Candidates who have gaps in their academic career after the qualifying exam., must furnish a gap certificate, in the form of affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper or certificate from the employer (if in the service) and should also furnish separately the character certificate of gap period duly attested by Notary Public.
- (v) Residents Certificate as per **Annexure- A to D**, if applicable: Candidates, who have passed their qualifying examination from a university located in the State of Haryana will be deemed to be Haryana residents and will not be required to submit certificates of bonafide residents of Haryana.
- (vi) No Objection Certificate from the Employer in the case of Employees of Govt. of Haryana, members of All India Services borne on Haryana Cadre, Employees of Statutory Bodies/Corporations, if applicable.
- (vii) Scheduled Caste Certificate as per **Annexure-F**, if applicable.
- (viii) Backward Class Certificate as per **Annexure-G**, if applicable and affidavitas per **Annexure-U**.
- (ix) Economically Weaker Section in General Category Certificate as per **Annexure-T**
- (x) Certificate in respect of Persons with Disabilities Candidates as per **Annexure-J**, if applicable.

- (xi) Certificate required to be furnished by the Children & Grand-Children of FreedomFighters as per **Appendix-H**, if applicable.
- (xii) Certificate from Ex-Servicemen of Indian Defense Services or Para-Military Forces Annexure-I
- (xiii) Provisional Allotment Letter

Note: Under the broad curricular area, Engagement with the Field, 20 weeks (4+16) shall be allocated over the two years for Tasks, assignments, Teaching Practice and school internship (Pedagogy and School Based Activities)

Distribution of Four Weeks

- During the first year, to support better understanding of schools and in preparation of Internship, teacher education institutes shall make provisions for visits to innovative center of pedagogy and learning - innovative schools, educational resource centers etc.
- Two weeks of First Year will be devoted to field engagement through different tasks and projects with the community, the school, and the child in school and out-of-school.
- Two weeks of First/Second Year will be devoted and 12 practice lessons with the teaching practice for Pedagogy of School Subject I & II.(Two discussion lesson in each pedagogy of school subject)

Distribution of Sixteen Weeks (School Internship)

Internship should not be reduced to the ‘delivery’ of a certain number of lesson plans, but should aim for meaningful and holistic engagement with learners and the school. During the Internship, a student-teacher shall work as a regular teacher and participate in all the school activities, including planning, teaching and assessment, interacting with school teachers, community members and children. Initially, the student-teachers will observe the school and its classrooms with regular teachers for **one week**.

For each student-teacher, internship should be conducted preferably in one school within the District of concerned College of Education for the entire another **15 weeks**. However, this period can be divided into two blocks in such a way that teaching in one school at a particular level (for example elementary or senior secondary) during one block, is followed by the teaching in another school or the same school at another level during the second block. Under any circumstances, the student-teacher should not be sent to more than two schools during her/his internship period.

Student-teachers should be provided opportunities to teach in government and private schools with systematic supervisory support and feedback from Principal/faculty of the school and concerned College of Education giving preference to practice schools and limiting to concerned District only. After completing School Internship from the school, the Principal of the concerned College of Education will countersign the Certificate signed by Teacher Educator of concerned College and Principal of the School.

Note:

- 1) Practical Exam for Course VI (A), VI (B), VII (A) & VII (B) will be conducted by the external examiners at the end of 1st Year.
- 2) Examination of Skill in Teaching and School Based Activities will be conducted by an External Team consisting of one Coordinator (Head Examiner should be of the parent University) and two Members (Sub-Examiners duly approved by the Board of Studies) at the end of 4th Semester. While constituting the team, teaching subject of the Coordinator will be taken into consideration and it will not overlap with the Teaching subjects of other two examiners. Thus, a team will cover all the three streams i.e. Teaching of Languages, Teaching of Sciences and Teaching of Social Sciences.

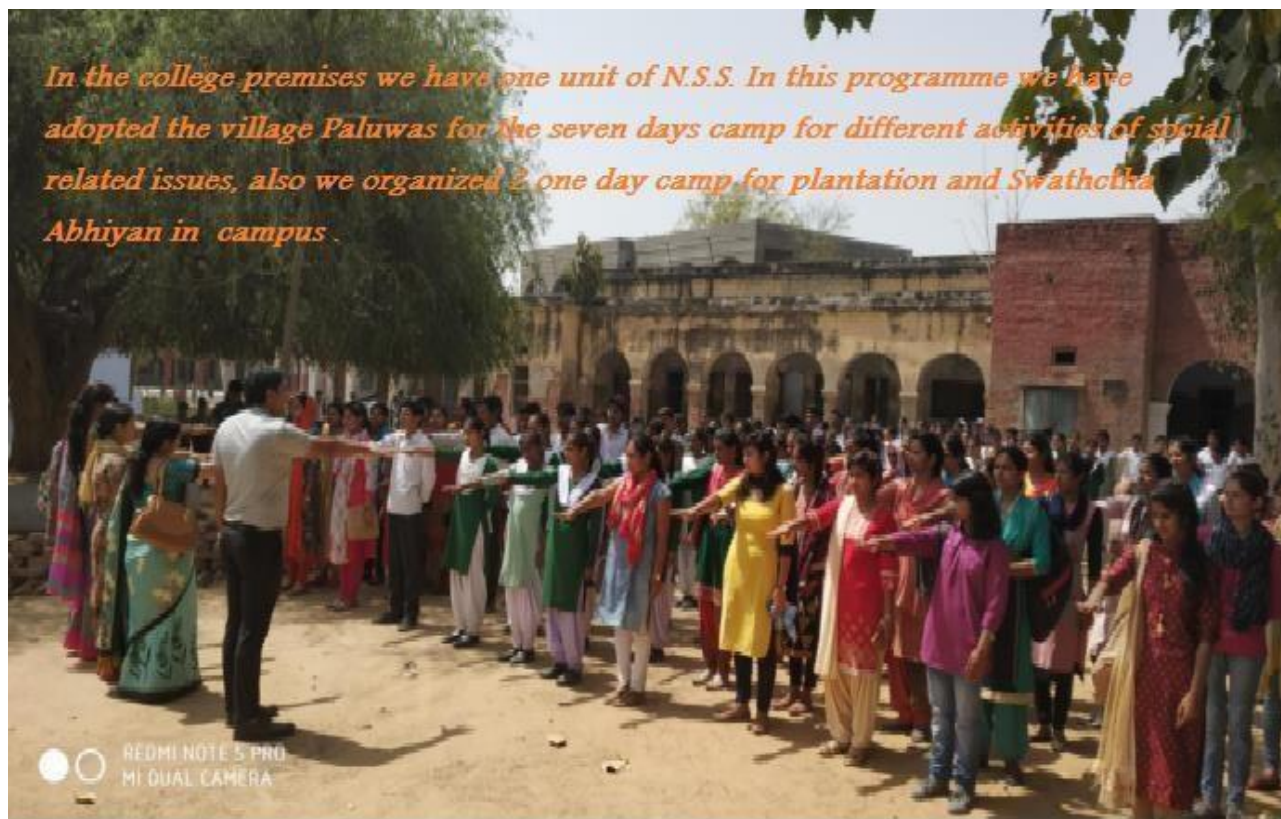

APPENDIX- A

Copy of letter No.62/17/95-6 GSI dated 3.10.96 from the Chief Secretary to Govt., Haryana, Chandigarh and addressed to all Heads of Departments, Commissioners, Ambala, Rohtak, Gurugram and Hisar Division, All Deputy Commissioners & all Sub- Divisional Officers in Haryana, Registrar, Punjab and Haryana High Court and all District Sessions Judges in Haryana.

Subject: Bonafide Residents of Haryana - Guidelines regarding

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institutions (including technical/medical institutions). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of **Dr. Pardeep Jain Vs Union of India** and others reported as AIR 1984- SC- 1421, where in it has been held that instead of word Domicile, the word Resident be used in the instructions issued by the State Government, and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate:

- i) Candidates who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana;
- ii) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/ dependents:
 - a) of the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or Working on deputation;
 - b) of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/Corporations established by or under an act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana;
 - c) of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government.
- iii) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of persons who, after retirement, have permanently settled in Haryana, and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the state of Haryana.
- iv) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of pensioners of Haryana Govt., irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana;
- v) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of persons who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;

- vi) The wives of such persons who are bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
 - vii) Children/wards of the accredited journalists residing at Chandigarh and recognized by Govt. of Haryana (added vide C.S. letter No. 62/27/2003-6 GSI dated 29/7/2003)
 - viii) Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; Provided that the parents/guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above mentioned categories are:
 - a) citizens of India;
 - b) produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents have not obtained the benefit of domicile in any other State.
2. All candidates claiming to be bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub Divisional Officer (Civil), Tehsildar (Revenue Department of the District/Sub Division to which the candidates belong). Resident Certificate in respect of the children/wards/dependents of Haryana Government employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of the children/wards/dependents of the employees of the statutory bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana and located at Chandigarh, in Haryana or outside Haryana, should be issued by their respective Heads of Departments.
 3. Candidates, seeking admission in educational institutions (including Medical and Technical institutions) located in Haryana, may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/Head Master from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Head Master of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate which should be sufficient.
 4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana, but at any subsequent time, it is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, and all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be confiscated. Principal/Head Master may take such other action against the student and his/her parents/guardians, as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
 5. These instructions may kindly be noted carefully for compliance.

Note : 1. The State Government, vide letter no. 22/28/2003-3GS-III dated 30.1.2004, has decided that henceforth Circle Revenue Officers (Tehsildar/Naiib Tehsildar-cum- Executive Magistrate concerned has been authorized to issue Resident as well as Caste Certificates (SC/BC/OBC). In case of Haryana Govt. employees serving in the offices located at Chandigarh/Panchkula and residing at Chandigarh/Panchkula, the Resident Certificate and Caste Certificates to SC/BC employees and their children will be issued by their respective Heads of the Departments. The proforma for these certificates have also been prescribed by the State Govt. (**Appendix- A-I, B & C**). Therefore, all the candidates will be required to submit such certificates in the prescribed proforma. The certificate issued by anyone other than the competent authority in the proforma other than the prescribed proforma will not be accepted.

2. Haryana Resident Certificate should be of the date of 30.01.2004 or after. Certificates issued before this date will not be accepted. The candidates must ensure that they get Haryana Resident Certificates and not Haryana Domicile Certificate from the appropriate authority as Haryana Domicile Certificate is invalid for the purpose of admission.

Copy of letter No. 1170-SW (I)-95 dated 7.6.95 received from the Commissioner & Secretary to Government, Haryana, Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department, Haryana, Chandigarh, addressed to all Heads of Departments, Commissioners, Ambala, Hisar, Rohtak and Gurgaon Divisions, all Deputy Commissioners & Sub Divisional Officers in Haryana and Registrar, Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh.

Sub: Exclusion of socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to the subject mentioned above and to state that following the Supreme Court judgement in the Indira Sawhney and others versus Union of India case, the Haryana Government vide notification dated 12.10.1993 had set up the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission. The terms of reference of this Commission were to entertain, examine and recommend upon requests for inclusion and complaints of over- inclusion and under-inclusion in the list of Backward Classes. Vide notification dated 26-5-1994, the Commission was also assigned the function of specifying the basis, applying the relevant and requisite socio-economic criteria to exclude socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

In its report submitted on 16.5.1995, the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission had recommended the criteria for excluding socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes. After considering these recommendations, the Government has decided that the benefit of reservation shall not apply to persons/ sections mentioned in Annexure 'A', which is enclosed.

All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Heads of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.

Description of Category to whom rule of exclusion will apply

I. Constitutional Posts Son(s) and daughter(s) of

- a) President of India;
- b) Vice President of India;
- c) Judges of the Supreme Court and of the High Courts;
- d) Chairman and Members of UPSC and of the State Public Service Commission; Chief Election Commissioner; Controller and Auditor General of India;
- e) Persons holding Constitutional positions of like nature.

II. Son(s) and daughter(s) of

- a) parents, both of whom are Class-I Officers;
- b) parents, either of whom is a Class-I Officer;
- c) parents, both of whom are Class-I Officers, but one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.
- d) parents, either of whom is a Class-I Officer and such parent dies or suffers permanent incapacitation and before such death or such* incapacitation has had the benefit of employment in any International Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years.
- e) parents, both of whom are Class-I Officers die or suffer permanent incapacitation and before such death or such incapacitation of the both, either of them has the benefit of employment in any Inter-National Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years.

A. Provided that the rule of exclusion shall not apply in the following cases:

- a) Sons and daughters of parents either of whom or both of whom are Class-I Officers and such parent(s) dies/ die or suffer permanent incapacitation.
- b) A lady belonging to OBC category has got married to a Class-I Officer and may herself like to apply for a job.

B. Son(s) and daughter(s) of

- a) parents both of whom are Class-II Officers.
- b) parents of whom only the husband is a Class-I Officer and he gets into Class-I at the age of 40 or earlier.
- c) parents, both of whom are Class- II officers and one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation and either one of them has had the benefit of employment in any Inter-National Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years before such death or permanent incapacitation;

- d) parents of whom the husband is a Class- I Officer (direct recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the wife is a Class-II officer and the wife dies or suffers permanent incapacitation; and
- e) parents, of whom the wife is a Class I officer (Direct Recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the husband is a Class-II officer & the husband dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.

Provided that the rule of exclusion shall not apply in the following cases:

Sons and daughters of

- a) parents, both of whom are Class II officers and one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.
- b) parents, both of whom are Class-II officers and both of them die or suffer permanent incapacitation, even though either of them has had the benefit of employment in any International Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years before their death or permanent incapacitation.

C. The criteria enumerated in A & B above in this Category will apply mutatis mutandi to officers holding equivalent or comparable posts in PSUs, Banks, Insurance Organizations, Universities, etc. pending the evaluation of the posts on equivalent or comparable basis in these institutions, the criteria specified in Category V below will apply to the officers in these Institutions.

III Sons(s) and daughter(s) of parents either or both of whom is or are in the rank of Colonel and above in the army and to equivalent posts in the Navy and the Air Force and the Para Military Forces:

Provided that -

- i) If the wife of an Armed Forces Officer is herself in the Armed Forces (i.e. the category under consideration), the rule of exclusion will apply only when she herself has reached the rank of Colonel;
- ii) the service ranks below Colonel of husband and wife shall not be clubbed together;
- iii) If the wife of an officer in the Armed Forces is in Civil employment, this will not be taken into account for applying the rule of exclusion unless she falls in the service category under item No. II in which case the criteria and conditions enumerated therein will apply to her independently.

IV Son(s) and daughter(s) of persons belonging to a family (father, mother and minor children) which owns land more than land permissible under the Ceiling Act of Haryana State.

V Income/Wealth Tax Son(s) and daughter(s) of:

- a) Persons having gross annual income of Rs. 4.50 lakhs or above or possessing wealth above the exemption limit as prescribed in the Wealth Tax Act for a period of three consecutive years. (Range of income has been revised from Rs. 2.50 lakhs to Rs. 4.50 lakhs vide Chief Secretary Letter No. 22/22/2004-3GS-III dated 22.01.2009).
- b) Persons in Categories I, II, III & IV who are not disentitled to the benefit of reservation but have income from other sources of wealth which will bring them within the income/wealth criteria mentioned in (a) above.

Explanation:

- i) Income from salaries or agricultural land shall not be clubbed;
- ii) The income criteria in terms of rupee will be modified taking into account the change in its value every three years. If the situation, however, so demands, the interregnum may be less.
- iii) Where the husband is in some profession and the wife is in a Class II or lower grade employment, the income/wealth test will apply only on the basis of the husband's income.
- iv) If the wife is in any profession and the husband is in employment in a Class II or lower rank post, then the income/wealth criterion will apply only on the basis of the wife's income and the husband's income will not be clubbed with it.

Explanation: Wherever the expression, 'permanent incapacitation' occurs in this schedule it shall mean incapacitation which results in putting an Officer out of service.

I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Government Notification bearing No. Leg.15/2020, dated 15.05.2020 vide which an Act namely, the Haryana Scheduled Castes (Reservation in Admission in Government Educational Institution) Act, 2020 was enacted by the State Government. In this Act under Section 3 and 6 following provisions have been made:-

***Section 3. (1)** Twenty per cent seats shall be reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes while making admission in Government educational institutions.*


***(2)** Fifty per cent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to the Deprived Scheduled Caste as enumerated in the Annexure.*

***Section 6.** A person belonging to the Deprived Scheduled Castes shall, for the purposes of section 3, support his candidature by a certificate of caste indentification issued by the ecompetent authority under **sub-section (2)** of section 5.*

2. In this Act, 36 Castes were included in the list of Deprived Scheduled Castes at Annexure to this Act. For proper implementation of this Act, all the authorities competent to issue Caste Certificate are directed to mention clearly that the Certificate is of 'Deprived Scheduled Caste' or 'Scheduled Caste' so that at the time of admission the Institutions may find out easily as to how many candidates applied

for admission and how many have been given admission under 'Deprived Scheduled Caste' category.

3. These instructions may please be brought to the notice of all concerned for strict compliance.


